

CASSINI Challenges Prize Contest 2026 Rules of Contest

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1 BACKGROUND

To get an edge in technological innovation and secure a place on the podium for the next generation of breakthrough innovation, the European Union needs to accelerate the pace of development of market-driven products or solutions powered by advanced technologies.

Space technology, data and services have become indispensable in the daily lives of Europeans and play an essential role in many application areas.

Galileo, Europe's Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS), delivers operational services 24/7 to more than 3 billion users around the world. Many sectors of the European economy rely on Galileo precise localisation.

At the same time, Copernicus, the European Earth Observation Programme, offers information services that draw from satellite Earth Observation and in-situ data. This information helps to better understand how and in what way our planet may be changing, and how this might influence our daily lives. Copernicus also boosts commercial applications in many different sectors by providing full and open access to Earth observation data and added value information.

The European Union Governmental Satellite Communications (GOVSATCOM) programme aims to provide secure, resilient and cost-efficient satellite communications capabilities to security and safety critical missions and governmental operations managed by the EU and its Member States, including national security actors and EU Agencies and institutions.

The EU Space Surveillance and Tracking (SST) safeguards space assets, especially EU Space Programme satellites, along with the space assets of EU Member States and other space operators. It uses a network of ground-based sensors capable of surveying and tracking space objects, together with processing capabilities aimed at providing data, information and services on space objects orbiting the Earth for Collision Avoidance, Re-entry Analysis and Fragmentation Analysis.

In this context, the European Union Agency for the Space Programme (EUSPA), is organising the CASSINI Challenges prize contest 2026, aimed at encouraging EU entrepreneurship and business creation by promoting the development of innovative solutions based on or contributing to Galileo, Copernicus, GOVSATCOM and SST, other space data and services and their synergies with other technologies, such as quantum and AI.

2 THE CONTEST

2.1 OBJECTIVE OF THE CONTEST

The objective of this contest is to promote the use of space data and technology as a potential remedy for commercial, social and environmental challenges. The prize shall foster the development of innovative solutions and recognize technological excellence and commercial achievements. By leveraging EU Space resources for satellite navigation, Earth observation, satellite communication, space surveillance and tracking, participants shall contribute to the advancement of the European Space industry, enhancing its global competitiveness and demonstrating the vast potential of space technology in diverse industries. This, in turn, will drive economic growth, technological leadership, and the strategic positioning of Europe in the global space arena.

2.2 THE 2026 CASSINI CHALLENGES

The 2026 CASSINI Challenges will focus on the thematic "**Space to Lift Europe**" that is designed to inspire and recognize innovative uses and commercialisation of space technology.

Applicants are requested to identify a pressing commercial, social or environmental challenge and submit their application presenting a Minimum Viable Product (hereinafter "MVP") as defined in section 2.3 below which addresses the identified challenge and:

- Leverages EU Space data and services such as Galileo, Copernicus, SST, SSA, or GOVSATCOM.
- Enhances the competitiveness and innovation and strategic autonomy of the EU space programme demonstrating market potential and commercial impact.

Applicants shall submit their application according to Section 2.7 ("Contest Process") below.

2.3 MINIMUM VIABLE PRODUCT (MVP)

A MINIMUM VIABLE PRODUCT (MVP) is a solution addressing the identified relevant commercial, social or environmental challenge/problem leveraging EU space data and services such as Galileo, Copernicus, SST, SSA, or GOVSATCOM and enhancing the competitiveness and innovation of EU Space Programme.

The MVP proposed shall comply with the following minimum levels:

- **Minimum Technology Readiness Level (TRL) ≥ 5** , (as defined at the following link [h2020-wp1415-annex-g-trl_en.pdf](#)), indicating that the technology has been validated in a relevant environment, and
- **Minimum Commercial Readiness Level (CRL) ≥ 4** , (as defined at the following link [Annex Commercial-Readiness-Level V1.pdf](#)), reflecting early market validation and the presence of a foundational commercial infrastructure.

NOTA BENE: Applicants are informed that non-compliance with the minimum levels above and/or failure to demonstrate compliance with said levels may result in the rejection of the application for non-eligibility (see Section 2.4 below).

2.4 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Subject to the fulfilment of the Exclusion Criteria set under paragraph 2.5 below, participation in the

contest is open on equal terms to economic operators (natural or legal persons) established in the territory of the Member States of the European Union.

Natural persons applying for the contest must be at least of 18 years of age by the date of submission of the application.

Participants may submit their application as individual persons (both natural or legal) or as a team of persons (both natural or legal).

Participation is further open to:

- economic operators (natural or legal persons) established in Norway and Switzerland **only** for what concerns solutions with prevalence of the Galileo component or satellite navigation, positioning and timing; and to
- economic operators (natural or legal persons) established in Iceland, Norway and UK **only** for what concerns solutions with prevalence of the Copernicus component or Earth observation.

For solutions that contribute to the competitiveness of the European Space Industry in the field of satellite navigation, Earth observation, satellite communication or space surveillance and tracking with no prevalence of Galileo component/satellite navigation or Copernicus component/earth observation, participation is further open to economic operators (legal persons) established in:

- non-EU countries associated to Horizon Europe where the association agreement applies to the present Contest. A list of associated countries can be found here: [list-3rd-country-participation_horizon-euratom_en.pdf](#); or
- countries which are in ongoing negotiations for an association agreement provided that the agreement applies before the award.

Economic operators referred to above are considered established in the EU / Switzerland / Norway / Iceland/ UK/Associated Countries when they are formed in accordance with the law of an EU Member State / Switzerland / Norway / Iceland/ UK/Associated Country, and have their central administration / registered office / principal place of business in an EU Member State / Switzerland / Norway / Iceland/ UK/ Associated Country (if legal persons) or they are nationals of one of the EU Member States / Switzerland /Norway / Iceland/ UK/ Associated Country (if natural persons).

Each applicant shall appoint a coordinator to act as the central contact point and represent the legal entity in all communications with EUSPA.

Applications shall present a MINIMUM VIABLE PRODUCT (MVP) meeting the minimum levels required under Section 2.3 above (i.e. **Minimum Technology Readiness Level (TRL) ≥ 5** and **Minimum Commercial Readiness Level (CRL) ≥ 4**).

NOTA BENE: Applications not meeting the minimum levels mentioned shall be considered ineligible and may therefore be rejected.

2.5 EXCLUSION and REJECTION CRITERIA

The contest is **not** open to:

- a) applicants being, at the moment of submission of their application and during the entire

period of the prize contest including the prize award, in a situation of exclusion under article 138 of the Financial Regulation¹ (as per the Declaration of Honour);

- b) applicants being, at the moment of submission of their application and during the entire period of the prize contest including the prize award, in one of the grounds for rejection under article 143 of the Financial Regulation (as per the Declaration of Honour);
- c) employees of EUSPA, EUSPA contractors and their employees providing services to the EUSPA, employees of European Commission ("EC") and European Space Agency ("ESA"), EC and ESA contractors and their employees working in the context of the European space programs and/or immediate family members (spouses, domestic partners, parents, grandparents, siblings, children and grandchildren) of the EUSPA, EC and ESA;
- d) beneficiaries of other European Union funding for the same action (see Section 2.7 (1) (iv));
- e) restricted persons² falling under the scope of or subject to EU Restrictive Measures.

Applicants shall fill in the dedicated sections of the Declaration of Honour.

2.6 NOTICE ON THE COUNCIL IMPLEMENTING DECISION (EU) 2022/2506 ON MEASURES FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE UNION BUDGET AGAINST BREACHES OF THE PRINCIPLES OF THE RULE OF LAW IN HUNGARY

In accordance to the Council Implementing Decision (EU) 2022/2506 adopted on 15 December 2022 on measures for the protection of the Union budget against breaches of the principles of the rule of law in Hungary it's been established that, where Union budget is implemented in direct or indirect management pursuant to of Article 62(1) points (a) and (c) of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2024/2509, no legal commitments shall be entered into with any public interest established on the basis of the Hungarian Act IX of 2021 (or any other entity maintained by such a public interest trust).

For this purpose, applicants shall fill in the relevant section of the Declaration of Honour (Annex I) and submit the declaration duly signed and filled in by each person (both legal and natural) submitting the application.

2.7 CONTENT OF THE APPLICATIONS and EVALUATION PROCESS

Following the launch of the contest via publication on the Website, applicants shall submit their application by the deadline specified in Section 3 and using the dedicated platform ([CASSINI Challenges application platform](#)).

Each application shall include:

- 1) The duly filled in **Application Form** including all the information to be provided online on the dedicated platform at the following link [CASSINI Challenges application platform](#).

NOTA BENE: as part of their Application Form applicants shall Indicate whether they have received any previous EU funding or support related to the proposed MVP and, in case, clearly and soundly justify how the submitted MVP differs from the previously funded solution to avoid double funding.

Applicants are informed that failure to disclose prior EU funding/support for the same MVP or to demonstrate differentiation from the previously funded solution may result in exclusion of the Applicant in line with Section 2.5 above.

- 2) A **Video** presenting the MVP and the person or team behind it (max 3-minutes³);
- 3) The duly filled in and signed [Declaration of Ownership](#) of the proposed MVP (see Annex II);
- 4) The duly filled in and signed [Declaration of Honour](#) using the template attached hereto as **Annex I**;
- 5) The duly filled in and signed **Identification Form** (available at the following link [Legal entities - European Commission \(europa.eu\)](#)) with the following supporting documents:
 - (for each legal entity participating): a copy of the extract of the inclusion in a trade or professional register, or certificate, membership of a specific organisation, or equivalent (Resolution, law, register(s) of companies, official gazette, VAT registration, etc.).
 - (for each natural person participating): a copy of a valid identity document (national ID card or passport) of the natural person.
 - (One for each applicant both in case of legal entities and/or natural persons): a copy of RECENT bank statement. With a bank statement, the stamp of the bank and the signature of the bank's representative on the identification form are not required. Please note that the bank statement must confirm all the information in the form under 'ACCOUNT NAME', 'IBAN/BANK ACCOUNT NUMBER' and 'BANK NAME'.

NOTA BENE: In case of award, the bank account for which the recent bank transfer was submitted will be the one used for the transfer of the prize money.

The photographs, as well as any other personal data (except for the name, date of birth and nationality) included in such ID documents must be redacted by each applicant so that they are not at all visible in the submitted copy. If, despite the aforementioned, personal data is visible, it is implied that the applicant has given its consent to its processing.

NOTA BENE: Applications must include all required forms, documents and supporting documents and information as specified in this Section 2.7 which shall be duly signed and filled in according to the requirements therein. Applications that are incomplete, including those with missing or partially completed information, may be excluded.

Applications shall be submitted using the CASSINI Challenges application platform at the following link (<https://cassinichallenges.awardsplatform.com>).

The proposals will be evaluated by the appointed EUSPA Evaluation Committee according to the criteria defined in Section 2.9.

The Evaluation Committee will evaluate the solutions against the award criteria. The fulfilment of the eligibility and exclusion criteria will be assessed only for the applicants proposed for award after the evaluation of their applications according to the award criteria defined below.

The Evaluation Committee will shortlist a maximum of fifty (50) teams based on the award criteria set below, which will present on-line their solution to the Evaluation Committee.

The Committee will re-evaluate, based on the award criteria set below, the solutions during the presentation and rank the applications accordingly.

The best twelve (12) applications will be proposed for award to the Authorising Officer subject to the assessment of compliance with the Eligibility Criteria (Section 2.4) Exclusion Criteria and Grounds for Rejection (Section 2.5) and assessment of the completeness of the Application according to the requirements under Section 2.7.

Both awarded and non-awarded applicants will be notified, via email and to the address provided in the application, of the outcome of the contest.

Applicants awarded a prize for their application will have the possibility to be announced, in person, at the CASSINI Entrepreneurship Days 2026 (or equivalent, see Section 3). In addition, the winners will be featured and promoted both at the event and on the official contest website.

Applicants will be notified by the EUSPA of the outcome of the contest. The notification will be done via email to all the successful and unsuccessful applicants.

2.8 PRIZES

A financial prize of € **100,000 (one hundred thousand Euro)** will be awarded to each one of the best twelve (12) ranked applicants as a reward for the applications submitted for the Contest.

2.9 AWARD CRITERIA

The MVP submitted by the applicants for the Contest will be assessed by the appointed Evaluation Committee against the following Award Criteria.

1. Relevance of the MVP proposed for the EU Space Programme

- To what extent does the MVP leverage EU space assets, data, or services (e.g. Copernicus,

Galileo, SST, SSA, GovSatcom)?

- To what extent does the MVP align with EU policy objectives and priority areas, contributing to the competitiveness and innovation and strategic autonomy of the EU space programme, while addressing a significant and relevant challenge within the EU context (e.g. commercial, societal, or environmental impact)?
- Does the applicant demonstrate active engagement with the EU space ecosystem?

2. Commercial Potential and Market Readiness

- What is the maturity of the MVP? (Minimum TRL 5 and CRL 4)
- Is there a clear development roadmap and go-to-market strategy?
- Is the target market well understood, with a clearly defined first use case(s) and identified specific customer(s)?
- Is there evidence of market validation (e.g. signed LOIs, pilot projects, contracts, customer interviews/feedback)?
- How will the prize money support market entry and/or business development?

3. Innovation and Feasibility of the MVP

- How innovative or disruptive is the MVP in its technical or business approach?
- What space technologies or capabilities are integrated, and how are they applied?
- Is the MVP technically feasible?
- Are risks (technical, market, regulatory) identified and appropriately mitigated?
- How scalable is the solution with respect to market, geographies and users?

4. Execution Capability

- Does the applicant have the expertise and experience needed to deliver and scale the solution?
- Are/is the applicant's key member(s) fully dedicated to the project?
- Are any skills or capacity gaps identified, and how will they be addressed?
- Is the MVP adequately financially resourced to execute the project (e.g. funding available/raised or partnerships)?

Maximum total points: 20 points.

Individual minimum thresholds per award criterion:

1. **Relevance of the MVP proposed for the EU Space Programme:** minimum 2.5 points – maximum 4 points.

2. Commercial Potential and Market Readiness: minimum 3.5 points – maximum 6 points.
3. **Innovation and Feasibility of the MVP**: minimum 3.5 points – maximum 6 points
4. **Execution Capability**: minimum 2 points – maximum 4 points

Overall Minimum threshold (total score across all four criteria): 12 points (out of 20).

Applications shall pass both the individual minimum threshold (i.e. per award criterion) AND the overall minimum threshold. Applications scoring **less than 12 points** (of a maximum of 20 points) against the award criteria and/or **less than the individual minimum threshold defined above per each individual award criterion** will be rejected.

For applications with the same score, a priority order will be established based on the following approach: the score for the Award Criterion 2. “**Commercial Potential and Market Readiness**” will be given a weight of 2 times with respect to the other criteria. If two or more applications still tie for any rank the prize will be equally divided and awarded to all applications with the same score.

2.10 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OF DEVELOPMENTS

Applicants will retain full ownership of the intellectual property rights on solutions developed within the framework of the contest, and exclusivity of commercial exploitation.

Additionally, the winners shall include Cassini/EUSPA branding in marketing material related to the development, such as the inclusion of a logo to the app/product webpage or any other form agreed without affecting the ownership and exclusivity of the commercial exploitation retained by the candidates nor the EC/EUSPA rights.

4 REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Participants may request additional information for the purpose of clarifying the scope of these Rules of Contest. Any requests for clarification shall be made in writing only to prizes@euspa.europa.eu.

The subject of the email shall quote the reference 'Cassini Challenges 2026 – Request for Clarification'.

Participants are invited to send the requests for clarification as early as possible.

The deadline for requests for clarification is 7 working days before the deadline for submission of applications (see Section 3 above).

The last date on which clarifications are issued by the EUSPA will be 7 calendar days before the deadline submission for each track.

EUSPA will provide the answers to the clarifications requested via publication of a Clarification Note on the dedicated page of EUSPA website <https://www.euspa.europa.eu/cassinichallenges>.

Interested economic operators are expected to check regularly the dedicated page for updates and Clarification Notes to be published.

5 THE ORGANISATIONAL COSTS

Participation in the contest is free of charge for the applicants.

Costs incurred in preparing and submitting a proposal as well as costs for travel to the Cassini Entrepreneurship Days 2026 for the Award Ceremony are to be borne by the Applicants and will not be reimbursed.

6 OTHER CONDITIONS

By participating in the Contest Applicants accept the terms and conditions of these Rules of Contest including the conditions set below.

6.1 ACCEPTANCE OF OBLIGATIONS BY WINNERS

6.1.1 Applicants accept that, if they are awarded a Prize, the EUSPA, OLAF and the Court of Auditors may carry out checks and audits in relation to the contest and the received Prize in accordance with Article 129 of the Financial Regulation.

6.1.2 Applicants accept that all prizes awarded in the course of a financial year shall be published in

accordance with Article 38(1) to (4) of the Financial Regulation.

Particularly, EUSPA shall be permitted to publish:

- (a) whether the recipient is a natural or a legal person;
- (b) the full legal name in the case of a legal person and their VAT identification number or tax identification number where available or another unique identifier established at country level, the first and last name of the recipient in the case of a natural person;
- (c) the logo;
- (d) a link to the website;
- (e) the locality;
- (f) the amount of the Prize and its nature and purpose.

Applicants may request EUSPA to waive such publication if disclosure risks threatening their security and safety or harm their commercial interest.

- 6.1.3 Applicants accept that the EUSPA, after each award, publishes (including on social media accounts) information about the applicant, such as team name and/or its application, such as description of the application, in order to promote the European space programme components and EUSPA's initiatives.

6.2 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 6.2.1 EUSPA hereby grants to the Winners a limited, non-exclusive, free-of-charge license to use EUSPA's name, acronym and logo solely in order to promote the award of the Prize.
- 6.2.2 Winners hereby grants to EUSPA, the European Union and any of its bodies and agencies a limited, non-exclusive, irrevocable, free-of-charge license to use certain of Winner's intellectual property, including Winner's name, acronym and logo, in connection with the Prize Contest and in view to promote and create awareness of the Prize results.
- 6.2.3 Unless the EUSPA requests or agrees otherwise or unless it is impossible, any communication activity of the Winner related to the Prize Contests must display:
- (a) the EUSPA logo,
 - (b) the following text: "has been awarded the [name of the Prize] of the European [name of the programme] Programme".
- 6.2.4 Winners are granted the right to name themselves as the Winners of this Prize Contest 2026 and may use this designation in the context of market communication, e.g. on business papers, advertisements, press releases, television and radio commercials, as well as in customer communications.
- 6.2.5 When displayed with another logo, the EUSPA logo must have an appropriate prominence.

6.2.6 Applicants shall not appropriate the EUSPA logo or any similar trademark either by registration or by any other means. Winner shall not create the impression to be otherwise endorsed by EUSPA and/or the European Union or part of EUSPA's and/or European Union's activities.

6.3 PROVISIONS CONCERNING PAYMENTS

6.3.1. Payments shall be executed in EUR.

6.3.2. Payments shall be deemed to have been made on the date on which EUSPA's account is debited.

6.3.3. The costs of the bank transfer shall be borne in the following way:

- (a) costs of dispatch charged by EUSPA's bank shall be borne by EUSPA;
- (b) costs of receipt charged by the Applicant's bank shall be borne by the Applicant; and
- (c) costs for a repeated transfer caused by one of the parties shall be borne by the party which has caused the repeated transfer.

6.3.4. EUSPA shall execute the Payment within the period of thirty (30) days starting from the day following the notification to the applicants on the Prize award. If the EUSPA does not pay within the time limits, Winner is entitled to late-payment interest as defined in Article 116 (5) of the Financial Regulation.

6.3.5. Where, after the award of the Prize, the award procedure proves to have been subject to substantial errors, irregularities or fraud, and where such errors, irregularities or fraud are attributable to the Winner, EUSPA may refuse to make payments or may recover amounts already paid in proportion to the seriousness of the errors.

6.4 RECOVERY

6.4.1 If total payments made by EUSPA exceed the amount of the Prize or if recovery is justified in accordance with this Terms of Reference, the Winner shall reimburse the appropriate amount in EUR, in the manner and within the time limits set by EUSPA. Interest may be recovered based on the statutory rate.

6.4.2 EUSPA may, after informing the Winner, recover amounts established as certain, of a fixed amount and due by offsetting against any amount the Winner has on EUSPA that is certain, of a fixed amount and due.

6.5 WITHDRAWAL OF THE PRIZE, RECOVERY OF PAMENTS

EUSPA may withdraw the Prize after its award and recover all payments made, if it finds out that:

- (a) false information, fraud or corruption were used to obtain it;
- (b) a Winner was not eligible or should have been excluded;

- (c) a Winner is in serious breach of his obligations under these Terms of Reference.

6.6 ASSIGNMENT OF PRIZES, SUBSTITUTION OF PRIZES

- 6.6.1 Winners shall not assign the Prize or its part or the rights and obligations arising from the Prize, in whole or in part, without prior written authorisation from EUSPA.
- 6.6.2 In the absence of such authorisation, or in the event of failure to observe the terms thereof, assignment by a Winner shall not be enforceable against and shall have no effect on EUSPA.

6.7 CANCELLATION OF PRIZE CONTEST

EUSPA shall upon its discretion and taking into consideration the principle of proportionality cancel the Prize Contest particularly if the objectives of the Prize Contest cannot be fulfilled anymore, or the award procedure proves to have been subject to substantial errors, irregularities or fraud, and where such errors, irregularities or fraud are attributable to the Winner, or through any form of interference by third parties or for any reason beyond the control of EUSPA the Prize Contest cannot be carried out as intended.

6.8 SECURITY

Activities related to the Prize Contest must be carried out in compliance with Commission Decision 2015/444, i.e. security-sensitive information must be EU-classified and if its unauthorised disclosure could adversely impact the interests of the European Union or of one or more member state(s). Applications that are to security-sensitive cannot be awarded a Prize.

6.9 LIABILITY

The EUSPA shall not be held liable for any damage caused or sustained by any of the Applicants, including any damage caused to third parties as a consequence of or during the implementation of the activities related to the contest.

6.10 APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION

The Prize Contest is governed by the applicable EU Law complemented, where necessary, by the law of Belgium. The General Court or, on appeal, the Court of Justice of the European Union, shall have sole jurisdiction to hear any dispute between the European Union and any participant concerning the interpretation, application or validity of the terms of reference for this contest, if such dispute cannot be settled amicably.

6.11 SEVERABILITY

If any of the provisions hereof is or becomes ineffective or invalid the remaining provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby. The ineffective provisions shall be replaced by other effective provisions that shall be identical to the commercial purpose of the original provisions or as close thereto as possible.

6.12 DATA PROTECTION

Personal data gathered for the purpose of the present procedure will be processed pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.
