1. SECURITY DEPARTMENT

The GSA Security Department (SEC) provides the security expertise in order to (1) facilitate security accreditation in line with the missions of the European GNSS Security Accreditation Board (SAB), (2) secure programmes' implementation and exploitation and (3) ensure a wide, secure and sustainable use of the Public Regulated Service.

The following high level objectives are set for the Security Department:

- achieve and safeguard the high level security objectives of the Galileo and EGNOS programmes;
- provide independent, balanced, timely and comprehensive security risks analysis to support the decisions of the Security Accreditation Board;
- manage security processes, monitor and enforce programmes' security requirements;
- ensure that the PRS development continuously achieve user needs, promote a wide and secure use of PRS and ensure compliance with the PRS Decision 1104/2011;
- support to frequency management and ensure compatibility and interoperability of the systems;
- inculcate a security culture within the GSA and continuously improve the image of the GSA, as a trustable and reliable security actor;
- support the European Commission in the definition and approval of new security requirements and international negotiations on security-related matters.

2. TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Head of the Security Department will report to the SAB Chairman for the activities linked to support to the Security Accreditation Board and to the Executive Director for all the other activities of the Department.

The activities of the Department can be summarized in three main axes, as follows:

1. Security Accreditation Board (SAB) support: SEC provides impartial and robust advises to the SAB, as per the applicable Reg. 912/2010 as amended by the Reg. 512/2014, in particular:

- Secretariat and Security Assurance Services: SEC staff supports the analysis, review and accreditation endorsements/decisions made by GSAP and SAB, respectively, including the secretariat support of the SAB and the GSAP, as well as security assurance services. Examples include IT security penetrations tests, risks analysis and strategies for accreditation of complex programmes;
- Crypto Distribution Authority-related activities (CDA), which ensures the management of the CDA Task Force and the appropriate management of the Programme crypto assets in line with applicable regulations, policies and practices, including the Flight Key Cell (FKC)-related activities; examples include the COMSEC baseline housekeeping and the due diligence re: the status of the current assets;

2. EU GNSS Programmes' support: this line of action includes a number of activities, such as:

- PRS-related activities for the preparation and facilitation of the PRS exploitation (such as pilot projects coordination, PRS service definition and user segment development Examples include development of PRS receivers, PRS protection profile approach, PRS standards group, and guide for establishment of Competent PRS Authorities (CPA) ;
- Security Requirements and Standards (Galileo and EGNOS), which provides security engineering expertise for EGNOS and GALILEO exploitation programmes with respect to security requirements;

examples include the preparation of the GSOPs ITT , and proposing solutions for managing cyber security threats for complex Galileo IT systems.

3. GSA transversal processes:

- Central Security Office (CSO), which provides security services in a horizontal manner which cover the whole Agency. CSO manages the overall security of GSA personnel, information and infrastructure. Examples include the management of large CI/CII facilities, the accreditation of classified IT networks, as well as the development of policies and tools to manage the personnel security.

The Head of Security Department is supported by the following team leaders: the CDA Manager, the GNSS Security Accreditation Manager, the Security Requirements Manager, the PRS Manager and the Central Security Office Manager.

This position implies regular travel within Europe to attend meetings with different stakeholders.

Furthermore, the Head of the Security Department will also contribute to other tasks of the Agency, as necessary.



3. PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS

A. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The selection procedure is open to applicants who satisfy the following eligibility criteria, on the closing date for application:

1. A level of education which corresponds to completed university studies³ attested by a diploma when the normal period of university education is four years or more,
OR
A level of education which corresponds to completed university studies attested by a diploma and at least one year of appropriate professional experience when the normal period of university education is three years;
2. In addition to the above, appropriate professional experience⁴ of at least **twelve years**;
3. Be a national of a Member State of the European Union or Norway;
4. Be entitled to his or her full rights as citizen;
5. Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by the applicable laws concerning military service;
6. Meet the character requirements for the duties involved⁵;
7. Have a thorough knowledge of one of the languages of the European Union⁶ and a satisfactory knowledge of another language of the European Union to the extent necessary for the performance of his/her duties; and
8. Be physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post⁷.

³ Only study titles that have been awarded in EU Member States or that are subject to the equivalence certificates issued by the authorities in the said Member States shall be taken into consideration.

⁴ Only appropriate professional experience acquired after achieving the minimum qualification stated in A.1 shall be considered. Where additional periods of training and study are accompanied by periods of professional activity, only the latter shall be considered as professional experience. Compulsory military service or equivalent civilian service accomplished after achieving the minimum qualification stated in A.1. shall be taken into consideration. Internships will be taken into consideration if they are paid. Professional activities pursued part-time shall be calculated pro rata, on the basis of the percentage of full-time hours worked. A given period may be counted only once.

⁵ Prior to the appointment, the successful candidate will be asked to provide a Police certificate confirming the absence of any criminal record.

⁶ The languages of the EU are: Bulgarian, Croatian, Czech, Danish, Dutch, English, Estonian, Finnish, French, Irish, German, Greek, Hungarian, Italian, Latvian, Lithuanian, Maltese, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian, Slovak, Slovene, Spanish, Swedish.

⁷ Before a successful candidate can be appointed, s/he will be medically examined by a selected medical service so that the Agency will be satisfied that s/he fulfils the requirement of Article 28(e) of the Staff Regulation of Officials of the European Communities.



B. SELECTION CRITERIA

All eligible applications, according to the afore-mentioned criteria (part A), will be assessed against the requirements listed below.

Please note that non-compliance with at least one of the Essential requirements (B.1) will result in the exclusion of the candidate from the selection process.

Advantageous requirements (B.2) constitute additional assets and will not result in exclusion, if not fulfilled.

1) Essential qualifications and experience

- i. University degree in the exact sciences (e.g. Engineering, Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Telecommunications, Electronics etc.);
- ii. Proven experience relevant to the tasks and responsibilities described above;
- iii. Proven experience in managing teams;
- iv. Knowledge (by training or experience) of satellite navigation technology;
- v. To hold, have held or be able to obtain a security clearance at the level of SECRET UE;
- vi. Excellent command of both written and spoken English;
- vii. Proven abilities to use electronic office equipment (e.g. word processing, spreadsheets, email, internet, etc).

2) Advantageous qualifications and experience

- viii. Experience in definition and verification of technical and security specifications and instructions;
- ix. Experience in handling classified material, including issues related to EU or national security;
- x. Experience of security-related matters of the Galileo or EGNOS programmes;
- xi. Knowledge (by training or experience) of the institutional framework and functioning of the EU and contract management in an EU context.

3) Behavioural competences

- xii. Motivation - open and positive attitude;
- xiii. Leadership and people management skills;
- xiv. Managerial, planning and organisational skills;
- xv. Results oriented approach;
- xvi. Self-control under pressure in demanding situations and ability to handle many simultaneous tasks;
- xvii. Excellent communication and negotiation skills.

4. SELECTION PROCEDURE

The selection procedure includes the following steps:

- After registration, each application will be checked in order to verify that it meets the eligibility criteria.
- All eligible applications will be evaluated by a Selection Board based on the selection criteria defined in this vacancy notice.
- The best-qualified candidates, those who obtained the highest number of points within the evaluation, will be short-listed for an interview. The minimum threshold is 65% of the total points.
- During the interview, the Selection Board will examine each candidate's profile and will assess their relevancy for this post. In order to support the evaluation via interview, shortlisted candidates will be



required to undergo written tests relevant to the job content (the minimum threshold for this test is 50% of the total points allocated for it) and to complete part of the process in their second EU language.

- Candidates selected on the basis of the outcome of GSA interview may be invited to an assessment centre, run by external consultants.
- Candidates will be requested to bring with them on the day of the interview photocopies of all the supporting documents for their educational qualifications and employment necessary to prove that they meet the eligibility criteria. GSA has the right to disqualify applicants who fails to submit all the required documents.
- As a result of the interviews, the Selection Board will recommend the most suitable candidate(s) for this post to be placed on a reserve list. The minimum threshold to be placed on the reserve list is 65% of the total points. This list may also be used for recruitment of a similar post depending on the Agency's needs. Inclusion on the reserve list does not guarantee recruitment.
- The reserve list will be presented to the Appointing Authority who may decide to convene a second interview and ultimately will appoint the successful candidate to the post.

Candidates are strictly forbidden to make any contact with the Selection Board members, either directly or indirectly. Any infringement of this rule will lead to disqualification from the selection procedure.

5. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

For applications to be considered valid, candidates must submit an email to jobs@gsa.europa.eu with a subject line of 'SURNAME_Name_Vacancy Reference Number' and which contains the Agency's approved application form (Download it here: <http://www.gsa.europa.eu/gsa/job-opportunities>).

This form must be:

- Completed in English;
- Fully completed, pointing out the professional experience relevant to this position (incl. calculation of years, months);
- Printed, signed and clearly scanned in (in one single document);
- Named as follows: SURNAME_Name_Vacancy Ref. number (e.g. SPENCER_Marc_GSA.2012.123).

The application will be rejected if it is not duly completed, if it is not signed by hand or if it is not provided in the prescribed format.

Further supporting documents showing evidence of the information given in the application will be requested at a later stage.

No documents will be sent back to candidates.

Applications must be sent to "jobs@gsa.europa.eu" and received by the deadline listed on page 01 of this vacancy notice at the latest, clearly indicating the vacancy reference number in the subject line.

Applications sent after the deadline will not be considered.

6. APPEAL PROCEDURE

If a candidate considers that he/she has been adversely affected by a particular decision, he/she can

- lodge a complaint under Article 90(2) of the Staff Regulations of Officials of the European Communities and Conditions of employment of other servants of the European Communities, at the following address:

The complaint must be lodged within 3 months. The time limit for initiating this type of procedure starts to run from the time the candidate is notified of the action adversely affecting him/her.

Please note that complaints made to the Ombudsman have no suspensive effect on the period laid down in Articles 90(2) and 91 of the Staff Regulations for lodging complaints or for submitting appeals to the Civil Service Tribunal under Article 270 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the EU (ex Art. 236 TEC). Please note also that, under Article 2(4) of the general conditions governing the performance of the Ombudsman's duties, any complaint lodged with the Ombudsman must be preceded by the appropriate administrative approaches to the institutions and bodies concerned.



7. SUMMARY OF CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary weighted by the correction coefficient (currently 75% for Czech Republic). The full pay is exempt from national taxation.

In addition to the basic salary, staff members may be entitled to various allowances, as indicated below:

In addition, newcomers may also be entitled to the reimbursement of removal costs, temporary daily subsistence allowance and installation allowance.

The GSA fully covers the tuition fees for 12 international schools in Prague (main languages: English, French or German).

Staff is entitled to annual leave of two working days per each complete calendar month of service plus additional days for the grade, age, for the distance from the place of origin and an average of 16 GSA public holidays per year.

Special leave is granted for certain circumstances such as marriage, moving, election, birth or adoption of a child, serious sickness of spouse etc.

Staff is covered 24/7 and worldwide by the Joint Sickness Insurance Scheme (JSIS). Staff is insured against sickness, the risk of occupational disease and accident as well as entitled for a monthly unemployment allowance, the right to receive payment of invalidity allowance and travel insurance.

In addition, GSA supports the further development of its staff and provides a range of training and professional development opportunities.

8. COMMITMENT
